

Point to Jesus

One of the things that I've found lacking in many Sunday school curriculums and Christian children's resources is bringing everything back to Jesus Christ. Often, a lesson will focus on a moral point instead of the whole picture of Scripture. For example, a Bible lesson about the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant may focus of kindness or forgiveness. Which is good, but it completely misses the opportunity to give the kids the gospel: "Like this servant, we own our Master God an unpayable debt. But Jesus paid the debt for us on the cross so we can be forgiven. We also need to be forgiving to others." Our Dynamites lessons will make sure to always point to the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Pre-Service Kids Club is a place for the kids to hang out before the 10am church service begins. This is a helpful way for families that arrive early, or serve in ministry roles to ensure their children are supervised and safe before service. Parents are welcome to stay and visit with each other to encourage more friendship building. Kids will be walked over to the main building shortly before 10am.



Kids Club Guidelines and Rules:

- 1. Kids must be registered and signed in by a parent each week
- 2. Kids must be respectful of adults, other kids, and church property
- 3. Kids cannot leave the building on their own
- 4. All supervising adults must have a background check

Volunteer Opportunities!

The Little Lambs Nursery (ages 0-2) and the Dynamites class (ages 2-5) are in need of volunteers.

Nursery workers provide care for babies and young toddlers: holding, rocking, playing, singing, feeding, and diaper changes during service.

The Dynamites class currently needs teacher assistants, or those interested in being trained to lead teach. Lead teachers prepare the lesson plan for each week they teach and guide the class through the lesson and activities. Assistant teachers help with the needs of the children and helping the lesson plan run smoothly for the lead teacher. Volunteering in our growing Children's Ministry is a rewarding way to

serve at Living Faith Church.
